THE ACCOMMODATION POLICY

- Brooklyn was formally approved as a building/group and recognised by the Pretoria Bar when the intended move to Brooklyn was planned some 20 years ago.
- 2. Brooklyn has since then always been a building and group recognised by the Pretoria Bar.
- 3. As you know the building is owned by a company, the shareholders of which largely comprise its tenants.
- 4. These shareholders have a material financial investment in the company and thus a stake in the building.

- All our existing leases are set to expire at the end of November 2020 and in the result new leases have been concluded with a commencement date of 1 December 2020.
- 6. We have also concluded new leases with new tenants to occupy chambers that will become available as a result of some of our group relocating to other groups. This process is an ongoing one.
- 7. All tenants in our group are and will be recognised as practitioners by the Legal Practitioners' Council.
- 8. This is the only statutory requirement for practising.
- Any attempt by the Pretoria Bar to withdraw its recognition of Brooklyn will have serious financial/commercial implications and will set us on a path of conflict, the outcome of which may well be that even more members will resign.
- 10. The reasons for the resignations by some of our members are well-known and need not be repeated here, save to remind you that the Bar's precarious financial position and/or the Bar Council's own decision, as communicated, that it would apply for the winding up of the Pretoria Bar, played a significant role in such resignations.
