Directive

1. Parties are to ensure that Joint Practice Notes, Heads of Argument, and all the documents of record are uploaded to CaseLines by Thursday 8 October 2020. In the event that any documents are filed out of time, a condonation application must accompany the late filing / uploading of the document.
2. All points *in limine*, points of contention and aspects on which rulings are sought must clearly be set out in the Joint Practice Note.
3. Matters will be heard on a virtual Zoom platform, and the legal representatives', and counsel's email addresses and contact numbers must be provided in the Practice Notes.
4. Zoom-invitations will be sent out over the weekend of 10 October 2020 and parties who have not received invitations by Monday 12 October 2020 by 9h00 must telephonically contact Mr Sello Tshetlho at 072 062 4733.
5. Parties are requested to e-mail proposed Draft Orders in Word format to sello.tshetlho@webmail.co.za on the day that a particular matter is heard.
6. Parties must note that members of the public, particularly final year law students participating in a mentorship programme of the SAC IAWJ will be provided with access to CaseLines and will observe the virtual proceedings.
7. Counsel must be robed when appearing on the virtual platform. Counsel must mute themselves when they are not arguing but they must be visible at all times when the matter is being heard. Counsel is not to engage in telephone conversations, drink beverages other than water, or eat while their matter is being heard. Despite the proceedings being conducted virtually, the Court's decorum is to be maintained at all times.
8. Mr Tshetlho must without delay be informed in the event that a matter becomes settled or postponed by consent.
